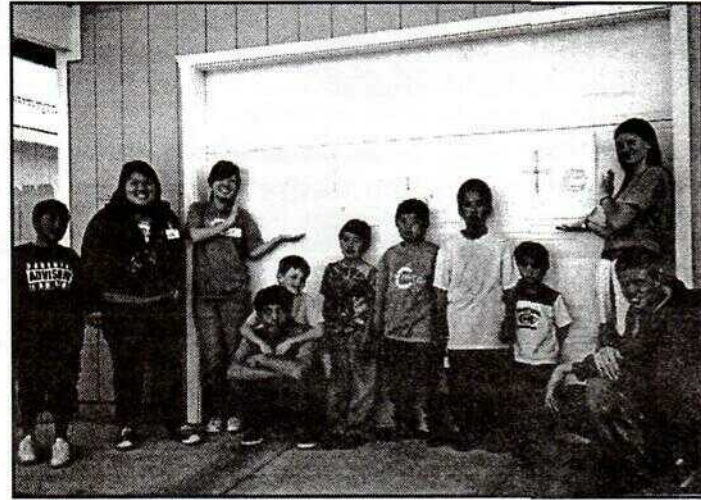

While we're **developing** and recruiting the team of people who can oversee a **volunteer** program (**Is this you, perhaps?**), we need others who can step up, organize themselves and be leaders. No prior **experience** is necessary; just be willing to investigate, **learn**, ask questions and find answers. The more you increase **your** knowledge and understanding of what Habitat for **Humanity** is all about, the more **help** you will be to the organization, even if just as an advocate.

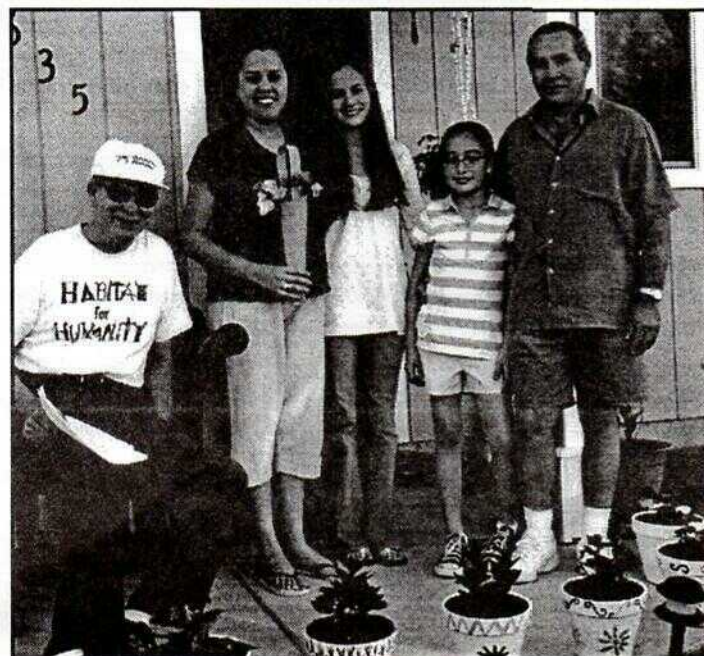

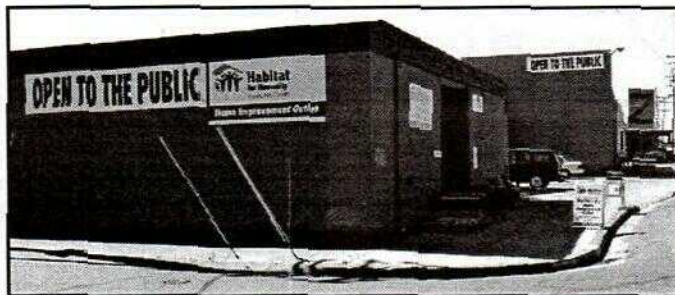
Miscellaneous, but still important
